*Saying where people are from: Ser + de + place*

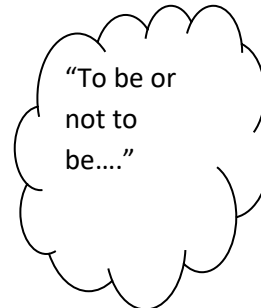
(Pg. 35)

- The verb **SER** means to be (am, is, are).
- When you want to say where a person is FROM use: (de = of, from)

**Subject/Person + Ser (conjugated) + de + place.**

- The question *¿De dónde eres tú?* means Where are you (inf.) from?  
To answer the question, you would respond. Yo soy de place.

**TRANSLATIONS:** *New York = Nueva York Spain = España*

Gregorio and Humberto are from Spain. Gregorio y Humberto son de España.

You (informal) are from New York. Tú eres de Nueva York.

You all (inf.,m) are from Chippewa. Vosotros sois de Chippewa.
