**Gustar** = to like/to be pleasing to  
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- Noun is a person, place, or thing. (sometimes an idea)
- Adjective is a describing describing word.
- Verb is an action word.
- Verbs are described as conjugated and infinitives.
- Infinitives mean the verb is in its simplest form. (To work, -ar, -er, -ir)
- Gustar = to like / to be pleasing to.
  
- To talk about things people like we say:

me	nos
te	os
le	les

**gusta... or gustan...**

**Gusta...**

- 1) **Nouns (singular = only 1)** -Chipotle, your shirt
- 2) **Verbs (action words)** -Infinitives (end with ar, er, ir)

- to answer in class= contestar en clase
- to teach = enseñar
- to look for/to search their dog = buscar su perro
- to arrive on time= llegar a tiempo
- to help friends = ayudar amigos
- to watch (Netflix) = mirar Netflix
- to listen to music = escuchar música
- to eat = comer

- Use “mucho” to say often.
- Use “poco” to say a little.

**Gustan...**

- 1) **Nouns (plural = more than 1)** - dogs, tacos, etc.

**Your turn!**

1. We (M)- like to help friends Nos gusta ayudar a amigos.

2. They (F)- like to watch Netflix Les gusta mirar Netflix.

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3. Jaime- doesn't like dogs. No le gustan perros.

4. I (don't) like Taco Bell. No me gusta Taco Bell.

- To specify exactly who you are talking about you say... or you want to **emphasize** that someone REALLY likes or doesn't like something

"a" then the person's name or subject pronoun

Examples:

1. A nosotros nos gusta sacar una buena nota.

3. A Jaime no le gusta correr.

- You cannot say "a yo" instead you say "a mí"

Dora y yo = A Dora y a mí

- You cannot say "a tú" instead you say "a ti"

Tito y tú = A Tito y a ti

**To ask what people like to do ask:** ¿Qué (no) te gusta hacer?

**To answer the question:** (A mí) (no) me gusta ... infinitive (verb).

- To ask someone if they like to do something (informally) we ask:

¿Te gusta infinitive? = Do you like to ....

¿Te gusta correr? = Do you like to run?

¿Te gusta bailar? = Do you like to dance?

**Your turn:** ¿Te gusta \_\_\_\_\_? = Do you like \_\_\_\_\_?

- To answer the question(s) above you say:

Yes, I like to. = Sí, me gusta.

No, I don't like to. = No, no me gusta.

**\*\* You need both "no's" because one is saying "no" and the other is saying "don't."**
